

Croix 2013 Old Manzana Slope Pinot Noir, Russian River Valley

Convergence :

Sharp, open swaths cut through old-growth oaks at the crossing Purrington Creek and Sebastopol's first golden age of agriculture—the manzana apple orchards. Replanted to Pinot Noir, the old slope pitches perfectly into the eastern sunshine, sits upon silky sediment called “Goldridge Dust,” and settles into a warm pocket of nature’s beauty.

Quintessential conditions for inducing perfection in the glass.

Illumination :

: Winemaker’s Insight :

A fuller and broader style of Pinot Noir, indicative of the hillside exposure, and one of Russian River Valley’s warmest locations within the Green Valley sub-appellation. The nose opens with aromatic concentrations of sweet earth, rose water, black cherries and allspice. The palate is exotic, expansive, yet focused with tongue curling acidity and a savory glide that finishes with substantial length on the palate. Anticipated maturity window: 2017 to 2025.
